school and will bring lots of experience as a former headteacher and current school improvement partner to the governing board.


Nut Free School

New Outdoor PE Kit

We are delighted to see so many children wearing our new outdoor PE uniform. They look incredibly smart and as the weather turns, the children will remain suitably attired in their outdoor PE lessons. The children have given us some really positive feedback about it – they love wearing it!





If you haven't got your child's yet, don't worry. This year, the uniform policy continues to include plain navy tracksuit (plain black is acceptable). Remember that this will be ammended ahead of 2022/23 to just plain navy or the new school tracksuit, however the new school tracksuit is very much available right now from our uniform supplier – Smart Choice Uniforms in Alsager. The tracksuit bottoms are priced at £10 (3/4 to 9/10) and £12 (11/12 to 13) and the hooded top is priced at £15 (3/4 to 11/12), £16 (13) and £18 (adult s/m/l).

Following the removal of the conservatory, we have installed new external doors and windows in Turquoise and Gold to match the ones we installed in the rest of the building 2 years ago — smart, secure and energy efficient!





The new Reception area now has a canopy between the new classroom and the main building. This will provide more protection from the elements for children, staff and equipment during outdoor learning.


