




TOTAL DOJOS




In celebration assembly, we also reveal which team won the most dojos each week. As you can see, thousands have been earned already.

Selfless Swimming

Mia in Aqua class is taking on the epic challenge of swimming the distance of the English Channel. This equates to 22 miles over a period of 12 weeks and is all in aid of Aspire - a charity which helps people who have been paralysed through spinal cord injury, helping them back to independence. It will equate to 1,340 lengths of a 25 metre pool - around 112 lengths or 1.85 miles a week! Mia has currently raised just short of £300.
