A message from Mr Cutts

The children have started the new half term brilliantly, not just through their hard work and concentration but through their wider endeavours. I share countless medals, trophies and awards in celebration assembly every week from the children's efforts outside of school and they inspire each other to not settle but to aim high.

We welcomed our school improvement partner, Mr Trippier, to school last week for his termly visit. His job is to help the school to achieve its strategic aims using his experience as an HMI and he works closely with me, other senior leaders and the governors. He was incredibly impressed by the teaching and the progress children are making across the curriculum, especially in maths and writing and by the wider opportunities within school. He was also full of praise for the children he met, who spoke warmly about our secrets of success and their learning.

We are well on the way to realising our ambitions this year and have very high aspirations for the Weston next year and beyond. These are exciting times for Weston pupils and credit goes to the team – school staff and governors who work relentlessly and parents, whose continued support is so incredibly valuable.

Power Maths

Our use of Power Maths to further enhance our delivery of the maths mastery curriculum is already having a noticeable impact on the teaching and learning of maths. More than ever, the children's brains are hurting after maths



lessons, in the best possible way. The approach includes high quality visual materials to help children with their mathematical fluency, reasoning and problem solving, which complements our

approach to calculations, where we use concrete, pictorial and abstract representations of number. The children really enjoy the Power Maths practice books, which are engaging, glossy and challenging. So far, children in Years 1, 2 and 3 are using the full approach. From next week the rest of the school will. If you'd like to see the practice books or resources next week at parents evening, please ask me.
