
<u>Jonah</u>

As you know, we successfully won a grant to replace all the external windows and doors in the school. Work begins during the holidays and is likely to continue into the first two weeks of the autumn term. It



may be the case that one or two key stage two classes have their lessons in the hall for a day at some point in those weeks. Apart from this, any disruption will be minimal and is not expected to have any impact on playtimes, drop-offs and pick-ups or the out of school club, including during the holiday. Governors

Mmm! Success savoured


