A message from Mr Cutts

Following my correspondence about online safety earlier this term, next week is Safer Internet Day. We will be taking the opportunity to reinforce the work that we do with the children throughout the year in this crucial aspect of child safety.

The Digital Ambassadors will lead a whole school assembly on Monday (before they head off to Boreatton Park) and the children will learn, in an age-appropriate way, about the following potential online risks:

Together for a better internet

Conduct – Children might be at risk because of their own behaviour, for instance sharing too much information.

Content – Age-inappropriate or unreliable content can be quite accessible to children.

Contact – Children can be contacted by bullies or people who want to groom or who seek to abuse them.

Commercialism – Young people can be unaware of hidden costs and advertising in apps, games and websites.

The rest of the school councillors have also been involved in the training and can also be relied upon to model excellent playtime behaviour and look out for those in need of a friend.


say we had lots of fun, despite the late night. What an experience!
